

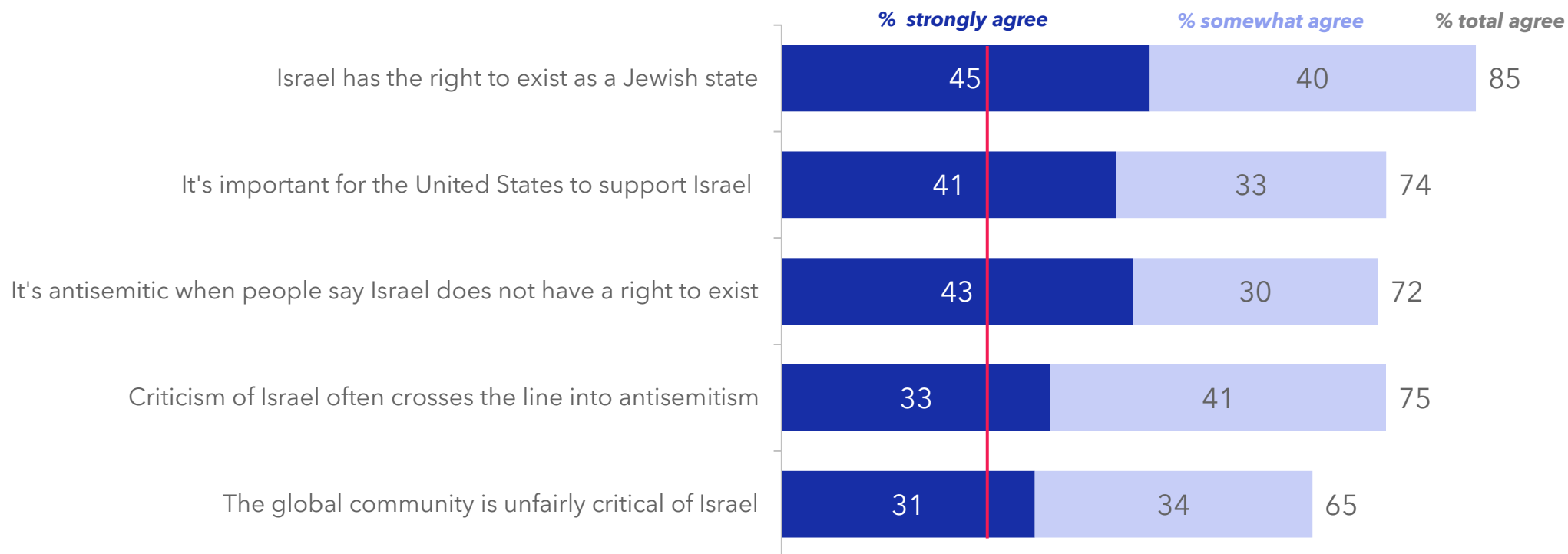
Attitudes toward Israel & Zionism

- 1) There is strong belief that Israel has a right to exist as a Jewish state (85%).
- 2) At the same time, more young Jews (66% in 2024) believe Israel's actions often conflict with their moral values.
- 3) 73% of young Jews agree that both Jews and Palestinians have a right to self-determination.
- 4) 42% of young American Jews said they have never heard of the word "Zionism" or have heard of it but don't know what it means.
- 5) When given the definitions of Zionism and anti-Zionism, the number of young people who identify as Zionist grows by 20 points (from 31% to 53%)

Young Jews strongly agree with statements in support of Israel.

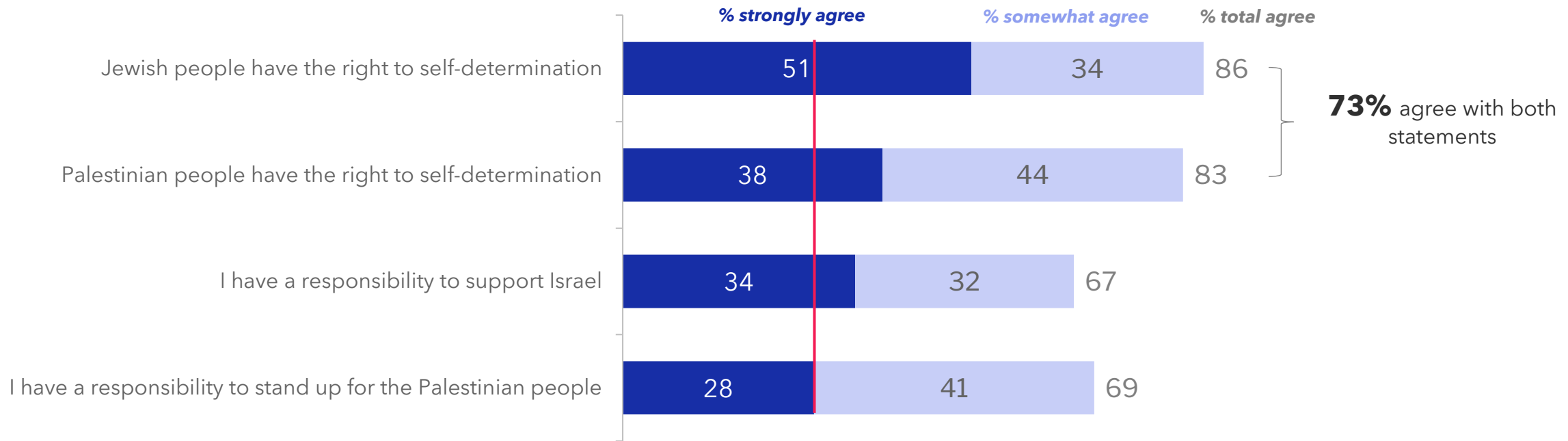
Note: Sentiments about support for Israel are stronger than anti-Israel sentiments

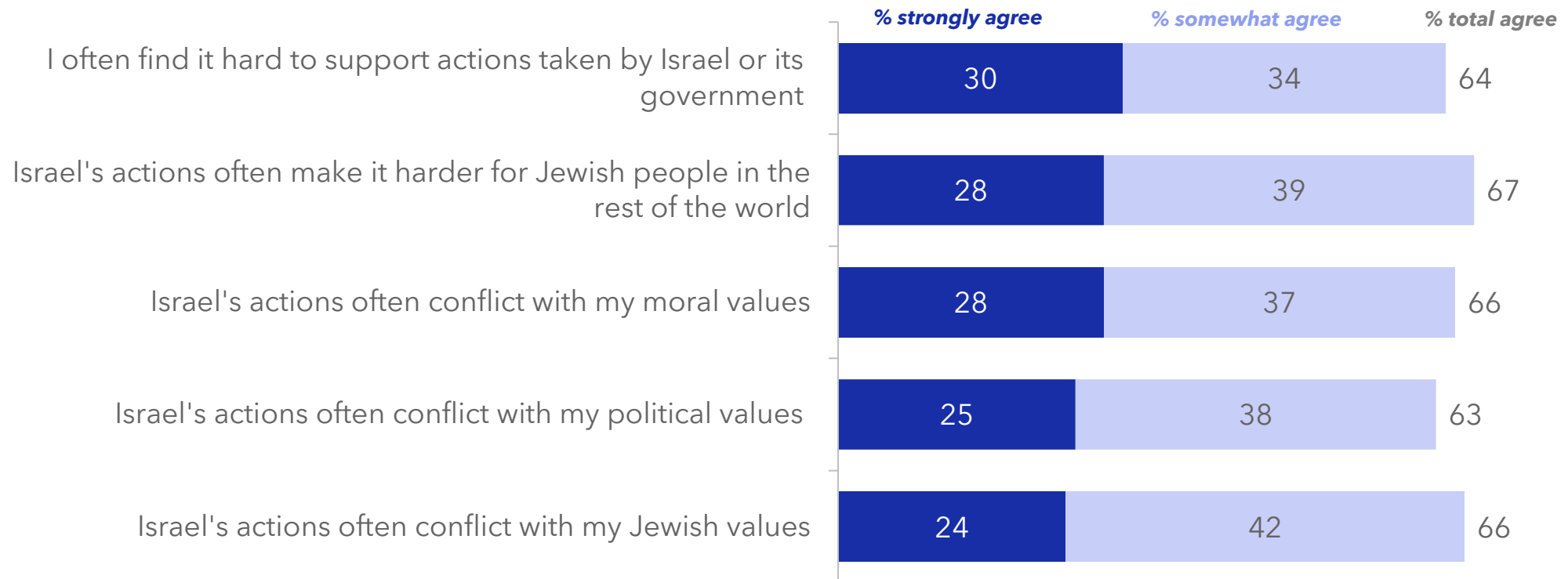
Most young Jews believe in self-determination for both Jews and Palestinians and feel a responsibility to stand up for both peoples

Young Jews are also feeling challenged by Israel

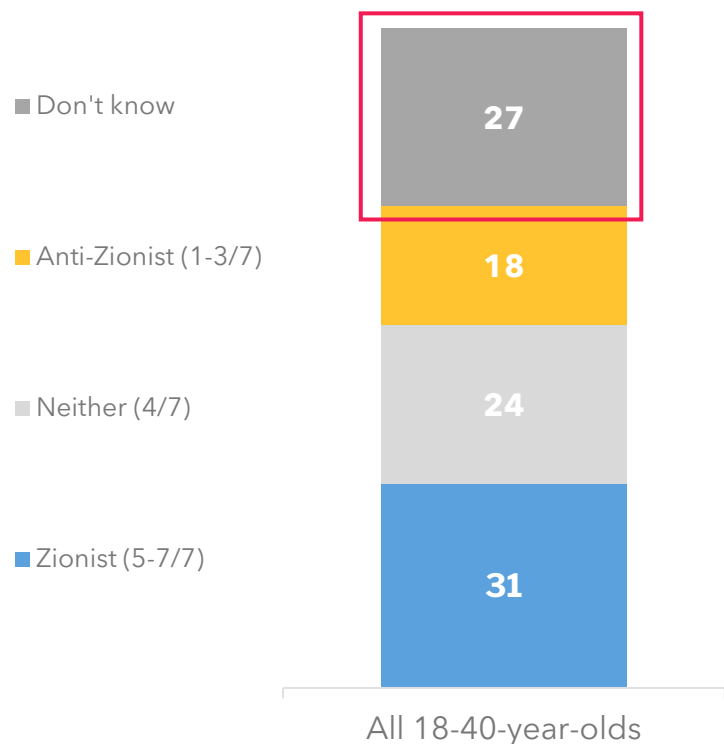

Which best describes you?

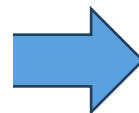
Using a 7-point scale with 1 being Anti-Zionist and 7 being Zionist

Zionism is a movement that supports the Jewish people having a state in their ancestral homeland, Israel.

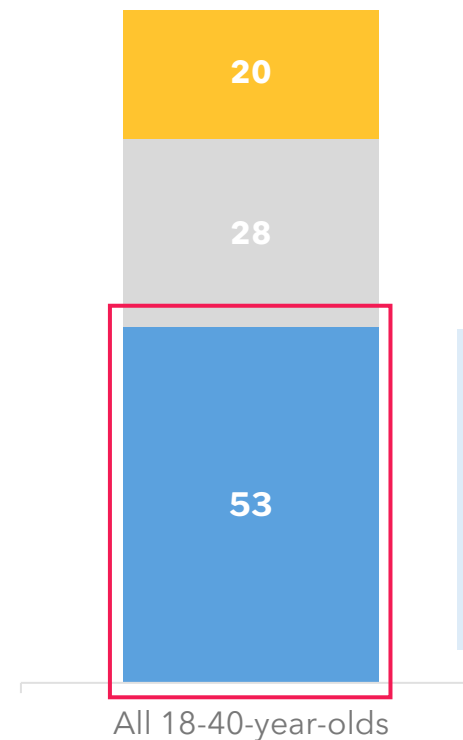
Anti-Zionism is a movement that does not believe the Jewish people should have a state in their ancestral homeland, Israel.
